

# Bursary, Internship and Mentorship Report: Summary and Results September 2018

#### Overview

In total, 13 bursaries were awarded to a carefully selected group of honors and masters students, studying in various fields within the environment sector.

#### **Financial**

The source of funding for the 2018 bursary and internship fund was as follows:





An amount of N\$651,977 was committed to support the students, 0.5% over budget (Fig 1), because the tuition fees for 2018 published in late 2017 were changed at the start of 2018, after the NCE had made commitments to students. Of the total, N\$382,137 (58.6%) was allocated to tuition fees (Fig 2). Other bursary support (accommodation, transport, books) amounted to N\$119,240 (18.3%). An amount of N\$150,600 (23.1%) was allocated to internship stipends and related field expenses for project work during which mentorship support was provided.




